The Levitical System of Sacrificial Offerings.

-	A structure was put into place for to be given and thanksgiving to be expressed to God.

1 John 1:5-6 – ⁵ This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

 The faults of the Levitical System of Sacrificial Offerings: The sacrifices made in the tabernacle and temple did not our sin once and for all. (Hebrews 10:11-14)
2. The of the sacrifices themselves were insufficient. (Hebrews 10:4)
3. Ultimately, the one offering that could actually take away sin could never be the results of sinful man's (Hebrews 10:5-7)
Jesus Christ is the better sacrifice; He fulfills all the requirements of God's holy law on our behalf. The Old Covenant pointed directly to Jesus and the work He would do to redeem the lost and draw them

near to Himself.
