The guys left in Kenya to run the ministry have worked hard and have done a good job. They visited Uganda and were able to do a seminar there. Since we arrived,



there have also been Awana seminars. We had forty Sunday school teachers attend training this week in Kangundo.

We are looking forward to celebrating our thirty-year anniversary on August 28th with ten US visitors and are looking forward to many more years of service. Hoyt carefully and completely trained seven young men over the years, (the current Kenyan Board) and many other pastors to carry out the work when he and Lois were gone. They are mostly running the work now. Shad, our Moderator, has been in America three times, and Fitz our Vice Moderator, has been there twice, meeting churches and supporters on that side. Lois' younger brother and sister, and sister-in-law are handling the work from that side, working as President, Vice President, and Secretary. We believe that the ministry is well-set to continue on both sides when Lois is no longer able. Things are in order for the future of KEM! Praise God!
