## Desiring the Higher Gifts

What should a Christian think about \_\_\_\_\_? How does our need for salvation impact the way we think about it?

According to 2 Corinthians 5:14-15, what should be the driving force that compels the Christian?

Verse 27 is the first point at which the Apostle Paul personalizes the body metaphor for the Corinthians:

**1 Corinthians 12:27** – Now <u>you</u> are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

Each of the metaphors of the church help our understanding not only of what the church IS, but also what the church is supposed to be \_\_\_\_\_

There are two Greek words used in the New Testament to describe spiritual gifting:

Charismata (used extensively in 1 Corinthians 12 and Romans 12)

Domata (used in Ephesians 4:8)

The first phase of God's gifting, as described here in 1 Corinthians 12, refers to the 'domata' of church leadership. And God has appointed in the church...

First, Apostles

Paul then shifts his attention to the 'charismata' gifts, gifts that represent a skill or ability that the Holy Spirit initiates or enhances in a faithful Christian.

When Paul encourages us to desire the higher gifts, note:
